

2020/21 Catch-up Premium Report

Our motto, 'To help one person grow is to help build the world', provides the framework for education in our school. We pride ourselves on being a small, nurturing school that focuses on the development of the whole child and we are committed to doing our utmost to ensure the highest quality of education for all our pupils.

In June, a £1 billion fund for education was announced by the government. Further guidance has now been released (<https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-catch-up-premium>) showing that the money is split between a Catch-up Premium and a national tutoring scheme.

The Catch-up Premium is funded on a per pupil basis at £80 per pupil. This is based on the previous year's census and will not include Nursery numbers. The spending of this money will be down to schools to allocate as they see best. To support schools to make the best use of this funding, the Education Endowment Foundation has published a support guide for schools with evidence-based approaches to catch up for all students.

Aims:

- attainment outcomes at the end of 2020/21 to be broadly in line with age-related expectations (ARE) and where the children should have been, judged from initial data in September. So ARE is key;
- that all children make progress and support is offered to pupils regardless of their ability, ensuring equal access and support to all;
- the mental health needs of pupils raised by the pandemic are met and supported by the school.

BARRIERS TO FUTURE ATTAINMENT

A	Embedding Reading across the school was interrupted by the lockdowns. Pupils from all backgrounds and abilities did not continue to progress in the way needed to ensure they became independent learners.
B	Maths continues to need extra support after lockdown.
C	Summer School to ensure pupils receive tuition in literacy, numeracy and sport.
